

Guidelines for *ProFacto* Submissions

Pro Facto welcomes submissions from its readers. Please follow the guidelines below. Submissions may be sent as either a hard copy or an electronic file. All submissions become the property of Oregonians for Rationality, unless the author makes other arrangements.

Letters to the editor should be 250 words or less and must include your name and contact information. Letters may be edited for spelling, grammar, and length. Opinion essays should be 750 words or less. Book reviews should be 1000 words or less. Articles should be 500 to 2500 words in length. Submissions will be selected for publication on the basis of available space, quality, appropriateness and relevant content.

If you have an idea for an article, contact the editors to confirm the content is relevant to this publication. Keep in mind that we do not publish articles on belief, religion or politics unless they have a scientific basis. If you are interested in researching a topic, but need writing assistance, please contact us. The *Pro Facto* editorial staff will work with authors. All authors should expect submissions to go through a rigorous editorial process.

In all cases, our goal is to educate and inform our readers. *Pro Facto* will not publish libelous remarks or inappropriate advertising. Under no circumstances will we publish attacks on an individual's character or morals, nor will accusations or insinuations of fraud by an individual be included unless the case cited has been so recognized in a court of law. Authors should avoid words like "fake" and "fraud." In the words of a fellow editor, "Keep your language scientifically pristine." Provide complete, accurate information and allow the readers to make up their own minds. Include complete references when quoting other sources or making claims.

Submitting Content for ProFactoids

ProFactoids originate from clippings from local papers, magazines and internet material that is sent to us by our readers. If you see an interesting article that deserves comment in the ProFactoids, please submit it. We are especially interested in items of local interest.

All items must come complete, including the source and publication date. If it is from a local newspaper, please include the name of the city in which the newspaper is published. If the item is from the web, please include the web address and the date you last saw it posted.

If an item is selected for use in the ProFactoid feature, the editorial staff will write the ProFactoid.

Policy for Article Use

Unless otherwise noted, original material published in *Pro Facto* may be reprinted without permission by groups recognized in the *Skeptical Inquirer's* list of international network of skeptics organizations. When reprinting, both the author and *Pro Facto* must be credited. All other publications must obtain permission from Oregonians for Rationality before reprinting any item.

Permission to use articles originating from other sources must be granted by the original publisher, author or copyright holder.
